

## My Journey Towards the Discernment of the Call to Priesthood

The journey of my Vocation started in my late childhood. I was interested in serving at the altar during Mass at our Outstation called Msongeni which is under Immaculate Heart of Mary - Kikelelwa Parish found in Tarakea. It was somehow very far from the parish, about 20kms, so we were getting only a single Mass during Sundays. With that experience, I grew desiring to serve God one day as a Catholic Priest in my life. My Catechist motivated and encouraged me always in my desire, since he was the closest spiritual leader to me at that time.

After finishing my Primary School education in September 2010, I traveled to Dar es Salaam, the most famous city in our country, to visit my relatives and to begin Pre-Form one studies (preparing myself for Ordinary level studies). Life at the city challenged my life of faith as well as vocation. Thus, I found myself no longer desiring to be Priest.

When I came back home on January of the following year 2011, ready to go to secondary school, my Catechist asked me about my Vocation, I answered directly without hesitation that I am no longer looking to be Priest in my life. He asked me why? I said, I do not feel the desire anymore. He advised me to go and reflect again to see whether that is the best choice I have made. I agreed with him. I was sent to Ungwasi Secondary School, run by the Catholic Diocese of Moshi, for Ordinary level studies.

While I was in Form Two, the second year in secondary school, the voice calling me to priestly vocation started again to resound within me. This time it was one of my friends who inspired me and succeeded to make alive again the call to priesthood. He was a new student transferred to our school from the Seminary run by the Congregation of the Apostles of Jesus called Uru, in which he failed to meet the academic requirements necessary for him to continue with his studies at the Seminary. He shared with me a lot of things about his life in the Seminary and what he knew about priesthood. Thus, I liked very much to listen to him when he was telling stories like these, although some of his stories were somehow far from the reality about priesthood in general. But they were necessary to make alive the call to serve God and his people within me.

My friend was also very much desiring to be a Priest, thus our friendship was centered in our common goal of life, in which we liked very much to be Religious Priests rather than Diocesan, but later I changed the plan.

In the end of our secondary studies, my friend who played a key role in my Vocation started to share with me that he is no longer feeling to be Priest and the desire was rapidly declining. I tried to advise him to be patient and fearless with the situation facing him and things will be better. He continued to share with me his experiences and lastly, after seeing the situation is no longer tolerable, he decided to quit the way to priesthood and focused on the marriage life. Thus I had no other choice rather than agreeing with him, telling him that I will be praying for him so that he may discern the true call of God in his life.

I thank God that the situation which faced my friend did not affect my Vocation. However, I think that God used my friend as an instrument to direct me to what He would like me to be in my life. And after my friend had finished that role he returned to what God has planned in his life different from his original intention.

After my Ordinary level studies, I went to government owned Moshi Secondary School for Advanced level studies. The school was not very far from the Cathedral of our Diocese. The Catholic Students in the school were under the pastoral care of Fr. Leodgard Zawadi at that time working at the Christ the King Cathedral. He was very close to us and especially to those who were showing the desire to be Priests. He explained to us about Diocesan Priesthood as well as Religious Priesthood and their distinctions. Thus here I was motivated to be a Diocesan priest while still retaining the desire for Religious Life.

After my Advanced studies I made a final decision to be a Diocesan priest desiring to serve God in my home Diocese. Later on, I perceived it as the will of God for in the processes of joining formation, that of the Catholic Diocese of Moshi went well without much difficulties contrary to my expectations. Now I am happy to be part of the family of Catholic Diocese of Moshi and I believe God is guiding and sustaining me in my journey towards Priesthood.

#### MY EXPERIENCE IN THE MAJOR SEMINARY

My name is Erick Machary, a first year Seminarian of Catholic Diocese of Moshi at Kibosho Senior Seminary.

It was 29<sup>th</sup> September 2023, when I arrived at Kibosho senior Seminary to start a journey of philosophy studies and priesthood formation. We were warmly welcomed by the rector of the Seminary Fr. Joseph Mahela together with the senior student of the Seminary.

Kibosho Seminary is one of the major seminaries in Tanzania under the governance of TEC (Tanzania Episcopal Conference - the bishops) providing philosophical and related Religious studies. It has nine resident formators, two temporary formators and two part time teachers. The number of seminarians ranges to 251 from the vast of all dioceses in Tanzania and a few from Religious Congregations. The Seminary life is rooted in four main pillars which are prayers, studies, work and sports.

Starting with prayers, we have Holy Mass every day here in the Seminary; moreover, we pray liturgy of hours in four sessions a day (i.e. Lauds, midday prayers, vespers and night prayers). Also, we have other devotions such as benediction, rosary and meditation. All these opportunities I use them to pray for myself, my family, for our diocese sponsors, friends, for all who implore my prayers for their needs and for the whole Church.

On the side of studies, we have 11 courses in first year, a combination of philosophy studies and Religious studies. For sure the subjects are interesting, for they reveal to us the truth about who we are and how we are supposed to be before our creator the Heavenly Father.

For the parts of works and sports, we have different faculties of manual works including farming, gardening, attending cows, pigs and hens, maintenance of water supply system and cleanliness. For me, I have been assigned in the maintenance of water supply system because I have skills in plumbing.

On the side of sports and games we play football, volleyball, basketball and jogging. Myself, I'm interested with football, volleyball and jogging. All these physical activities strengthen our health of both mind and body.

Generally, the Seminary life is livable, and so I implore your prayers so that one day I could serve God and His flocks in accordance with His will.
